

Modules in English for Inbound Exchange Students in the Spring Semester 2025

- Inbound exchange students should always contact their UZH study coordinators to discuss their module choices.
- In addition to booking modules from their own study subjects, inbound exchange students are allowed to book certain modules from other subjects as well.
- Should students need more ECTS Credits in general or are interested in booking a module from another study subject, they can add a few modules from this list.
- Please only book modules that correspond with your study level (i.e. BA-level students only book BA-level modules and MA-level students only book MA-level modules).
- Please note that pass/fail modules are never graded, which means that you will not receive a grade on the UZH transcript of records.

This list contains two types of modules (indicated in table below):

Type A: Modules that were created especially for inbound exchange students (open to BA and/or MA level students)
 These modules are open to any students from the respective study level (BA and/or MA) and no previous knowledge is needed at all.

Type B: Modules from the regular study program of UZH departments that are also open to inbound students from other subjects
 Some departments at the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences have agreed to open some regular modules to inbound exchange students from other subjects. Since these modules are part of the regular study program of a department, for some of them, previous knowledge might be beneficial. Islam and Politics in Asia (Seminar)

Course description:

The interplay between Islam and politics tends to be read through the Middle Eastern lens, a trope due to Islam's historical origins in and continued association with the Arabian Peninsula. Nearly half the world's Muslim population, however, is located in four South and Southeast Asian countries—Indonesia, Pakistan, India, and Bangladesh. Other countries, like China, are home to significant Muslim minorities. This course focuses on religion and politics in regions often understood as peripheral to Islam but where most Muslims actually live. It will introduce students to major themes and issues pertaining to Muslim politics in selected Asian countries. Students will read a wide range of scholarship by historians, socio-anthropologists, political scientists, and specialists of Islam. By the end of the semester, students will be able to understand the multiple ways Islam is mobilized in the political sphere and how Muslims engage with politics *as Muslims*—on domestic issues as well as transnational matters. Moreover, as the course critically engages with core concepts, such as Islamism and secularism, students will build a conceptual toolbox to think more broadly about religion, politics, and the state management of religion.

Learning Objectives:

- Acquiring the conceptual tools to think about political Islam, the interplay of religion and politics, and the state management of religion.
- Gaining familiarity and critically engaging with contemporary scholarship on the study of political Islam.
- Understanding the specific ways in which Asian Muslims engage with politics, both domestically and internationally.
- Learning about several specific Asian cases: India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Indonesia, China, among others. Students will be encouraged to think comparatively across these cases.
- Improving academic writing and oral presentation skills.

This module awards 6 ECTS. Spaces are not limited.

Towards an Understanding of Human Aggression (Seminar)

Course description:

Since a few years, the world is witnessing renewed and new individual and collective acts of violent human aggression, from school shootings to new international and non-international wars. This course will attempt to elucidate the phenomenon of human aggression – both individual and collective – from an interdisciplinary perspective as well as present different approaches on how philosophy has tried to both conceptualize and morally evaluate it. Session topics and discussions range from the neurobiological “aggression apparatus” in the human brain over past and current philosophical conceptualizations of aggression and aggressiveness, the ethical assessment of both situations of individual aggressive behavior and war, to potentials of aggression’s less violent and potentially more constructive expression.

Special Treat: Renowned physician Joachim Bauer will give a talk on the “aggression apparatus” of the human brain (session of 11 March 2025). International mediator Dr. Marco Ronzani will hold a practical workshop on nonviolent communication (session of 27 May 2025).



Learning Objectives:

- Understanding the difference between a philosophical question and questions of other disciplines.
- Acquiring to read, analyze, and interpret works in the philosophy of aggression and to critically discuss and scrutinize the existing state of the art in this philosophical literature.
- Ability to analyze contemporary public debates about individual and collective aggression and engage in it with an opinion informed by distinct scholarly backgrounds but from a philosophical distance.
- Ability to articulate and defend well-reasoned arguments in written and oral form, and ability to do this both in a concise and structured manner.
- Ability to interact and respectfully discuss with peers of other disciplines.

Module enrolment:

This module awards 6 ECTS. Spaces are limited to 40 students.
